## Make your own!

You will need:

- a foil baking cup
- a strip of paper 3/4" x 6-5/8"
- tape
- something pointy, like a toothpick

- 1 Separate one baking cup from the others and remove the paper liner. (**Note:** If you have a pot stand at least 2" tall and you are mechanically challenged, have ham fists and/or sausage fingers, are lazy or in a hurry, stop now. Your stove is done.)
- 2 Make a form by taping the strip of paper into a circle.
- 3 Push the foil cup into the form, and flatten the sides of the cup by turning and squeezing the pleats between thumb and forefinger.
- 4 Bend the sides of the cup toward the center, making a 90° angle at the top of the form.
- 5 About halfway between the center hole and the form poke 8-12 evenly spaced burner holes with something pointy like a round toothpick.
- 6 Carefully remove your Orion Stove from the form, flatten another foil cup to make a base reflector and follow the instructions on page 2 for making your very own 2 gram Orion Pot Stand.
